2. About the Catalogue of Competencies

The Catalogue of Competencies presents a framework for competencies in global health research at doctoral and postdoctoral levels that considers diverse disciplines and progressive development of different competency levels. It centers discipline-specific research knowledge, skills, and attitudes of individual researchers (Domain 0), and the integration of global perspectives for research (Domain 7), while addressing essential competencies for all researchers (Domains 1-6) that are specifically adapted for work in the field of global health.
